



Dear Parents/Carers

I just wanted to write to you as it is the start of a new academic year and to welcome all our students as they embark on the next step of their educational journey.

Results

We are very pleased that we have had an increase in our results and although we are on a journey the changes that have been implemented are already having an impact on outcomes. In terms of overall progress we have seen a huge increase, especially in our Value Added as it is the best the school has seen in recent history. Some departments have done extremely well: Maths, Science, Modern Foreign Languages and RE with significant increases in progress, attainment and A*-A grades. We are an improving school and some of the changes do take longer to embed. The processes and procedures however have to be sustainable and we have ensured they are, rather than a 'quick fix' approach.

Uniform

I also wanted to thank you for your patience over the issues around our new uniform and especially the school skirt. Unfortunately the company we have been using has not delivered and I can only apologise for the inconvenience. We have been working on solutions on an individual basis with parents/carers and are trying to resolve the problems as quickly as possible. The new uniform however does look very smart and we have had many positive comments, despite the delivery issues.

Safer Schools Partnership

Keeping young people safe is paramount and schools play a pivotal role in this. I have decided that as a school we need to be proactive within our community to ensure that we work in partnership with all the available agencies. I have therefore entered into the Safer Schools Partnership where we will work alongside the Police to keep young people educated and safe.

What this will mean is that Sir Thomas Boteler Church of England High School will have a full time Youth Engagement School Based Police Officer on our staff. Her name is PC Shelly Lister and she comes with over 12 years of Police experience. This relationship is all about partnership working and represents a new approach to Police involvement in schools. We will benefit from PC Lister's wide skill set and knowledge which will really support the school, our students and wider community.

Some core responsibilities will include:

- Being a positive role model for the students and wider school community
- Undertaking targeted PHSE and citizenship inputs as appropriate, and agreed by the school, thereby contributing to the school learning environment.
- Using resources from the Safer Schools Partnership to support with e-safety and the government's Prevent agenda for example.
- Being involved with the school and education welfare service in supporting good attendance.
