

Dear Parent/Carer

As we approach the start of the **May Mock Exams** which will run from **Tuesday 4th May to Friday 21**st **May**, I would like to take this opportunity of thanking you for your ongoing support and cooperation during this difficult year. I would also like to congratulate our Year 11 students who have shown real resilience in response to the challenges, caused by the pandemic, that they have faced during their KS4 studies. Their return to face to face teaching from remote learning has been excellent and they have been commended by our teachers. As mentioned in previous correspondence, these exams will not assess the entirety of the course. They will only assess what students have been taught and know.

I can confirm that **the last teaching day for Year 11 is Friday 21**st **May** when students have completed the English Literature mock exam that finishes at **12:20pm**. Students will follow their normal timetable up until this date. When students have completed their mock exam in a subject they will be expected to bring sufficient material to their lessons where they will be revising and preparing for mock exams and assessments in their other subjects which are still to take place.

From Monday 24th May, colleges/apprenticeship providers will be in touch with information regarding transition units which students will be able to access remotely which will be on offer helping students prepare for when they start college/apprenticeships in September. We will signpost and timetable this to support learners where possible.

Each Year 11 student will only officially leave school once they have had an **exit interview** that will take place with a senior member of staff. These interviews will be on an appointment basis and run from **Monday 24**th **May to Friday 11**th **June**. Students will not be required to wear uniform.

All students are invited to attend the **Year 11 Leavers Service** at **2pm** in the **School Hall** on **Friday 28th May** which provides the final opportunity for students to join together as a year group. The Service will be a celebration of our students' time with the Boteler Family and a very memorable experience. As with the exit interviews, students are not required to wear uniform. They may however, want to bring in a school shirt to be signed.

Teacher Assessed Grade (TAG)

As mentioned previously, the 2021 GCSE grades will be a Teacher Assessed Grade (TAG). This is a grade that is awarded from a broad evidence base. The sources of evidence which have been used to formulate this grade has been clearly explained to the students by each individual subject teacher. This process is also the same for BTEC subjects. I have included a summary of the evidence used for each subject at the end of this letter.



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
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Students must raise any concerns about the evidence being used to determine their grade, where for example, the evidence was affected by their personal circumstances, such as illness or other mitigating circumstances, in their exit interview. Any discussions about mitigating circumstances which may warrant special consideration will be recorded/noted by the member of staff conducting the meeting.

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
